Department of Education - Jacob K. Javits Fellowships

Synopsis: The purpose of the Jacob K. Javits Fellowship (JKJ) Program is to award fellowships to eligible students of superior ability -- selected on the basis of demonstrated achievement, financial need, and exceptional promise -- to undertake graduate study in selected fields in the arts, humanities, and social sciences leading to a doctoral degree, or to a master's degree in those fields in which the master's degree is the terminal highest degree awarded in the selected field of study at accredited institutions of higher education.

Deadline: Oct. 15, 2007.

National Academies Ford Foundation Predoctoral Diversity Fellowship for Achieving Excellence in College and University Teaching

Synopsis: Through its program of Diversity Fellowships, the Ford Foundation seeks to increase the diversity of the nation's college and university faculties by increasing their ethnic and racial diversity, to maximize the educational benefits of diversity, and to increase the number of professors who can and will use diversity as a resource for enriching the education of all students.

GEM Fellowship

Synopsis: The National GEM Consortium's primary focus is to administer and award full fellowships with paid internships to highly qualified under-represented students who wish to pursue graduate studies in engineering or science. GEM's program activities, however, go beyond financial support by engendering student success in academic and professional environments. GEM has a solid success record in implementing effective programs to increase the recruitment, retention, and graduation of minority students.

Deadline: **Jan. 10, 2008.**

American Association of University Women - Master's and First Professional Awards

Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
